



DID YOU KNOW



THERE IS MASSIVE LAW-BREAKING By CHILDREN'S AID SOCIETY WORKERS FROM ACROSS ONTARIO THAT NEEDS TO BE STOPPED

THE SOCIAL WORK AND SOCIAL SERVICES WORK ACT (1998) WAS PROCLAIMED INTO LAW ON AUGUST 15, 2000 WHICH REQUIRED ALL PERSONS WHO ENGAGED IN THE PRACTICE OF SOCIAL WORK TO BECOME REGISTERED WITH THE ONTARIO COLLEGE OF SOCIAL WORKERS (COLLEGE). UNDER THE ACT THE COLLEGE WAS LEGISLATED THE DUTY OF CARE TO REGULATE THE PRACTICE OF SOCIAL WORK IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO.

MOST FRONT LINE WORKERS WITH ONTARIO'S VARIOUS CAS AGENCIES IN ONTARIO ENGAGE IN THE PRACTICE OF SOCIAL WORK DURING THE COURSE OF THEIR JOB RELATED ACTIVITIES, YET MOST ARE NOT REGISTERED WITH THE COLLEGE AND MOST INTENTIONALLY DO NOT BECOME MEMBERS. LITTLE HAS BEEN DONE BY AUTHORITIES TO CORRECT THESE VIOLATIONS.

LAW BREAKING IN OUR SCHOOL BY CAS/FACS

CAS/FACS workers have been going into schools and other public institutions and breaking the law right under the noses of school officials and public institutions as well. The problem of CAS/FACS workers breaking the law has become widespread. A number of school boards have developed policies which violate the Charter Rights of children and parents and in some cases violate the Criminal Code of Canada.
